General Regulations Governing Use of the Building Fees and contributions are used for the upkeep of the Historical Building

The Historic Green Street Church, the first church building in Englewood was built in 1928. It is a historic site owned and maintained by the Lemon Bay Historical Society, a non-profit volunteer organization.

The church building is air conditioned and a SMOKE FREE environment. No beverages, food or <u>animals</u> (except guide dogs for the visually impaired) are allowed in the building.

Rentals of the site includes: 14 pews seating 70 people; chairs are available also.

Deliveries of rented items must be within the time frame specified on the application and must be removed promptly.

Applicants are responsible for any damage that may occur related to their event. The applicant, also assumes full responsibility for accident or injury to their guests.

The Bride's Room is available for changing. It is <u>suggested</u> that a person be <u>designated</u> for picking up and removing all personal belongings or other items such as florist boxes, coat hangers, etc while pictures are being taken immediately after the <u>Wedding</u> Ceremony.

The church bell may be rung for a brief period after the Wedding Ceremony. Lighted candles are not allowed in the building.

Bows of floral arrangements can be attached to pews with ribbons, rubber bands or wrapped flower wire. No tape, florist's clay, tacks or nails may be used on any part of the building or furnishings. Building must be left in the condition found.

A representative of the Lemon Bay Historical Society will be on the premises through all events.
